## 16 Fridge cameras

## What does it do?



Fridge cameras can be installed inside a fridge. They take a picture of the inside of the fridge each time the door is closed. The picture is then sent immediately to a connected smartphone app. Fridge cameras act as a shopping aid by ensuring that the user is up to date with the content of their fridge, thus helping to reduce waste.

## What can it be used for?

**#ActivityMonitoring** Carers are notified immediately by the picture sent to their app when the PwD has used the fridge. The picture can also let them know what has been taken out of the fridge. This can let carers conclude whether, when, and what the PwD is eating. This can be relevant to investigate sudden weight fluctuations which can be caused by people forgetting to eat or how to prepare a meal due to their illness.
